Bobby Ammerman is a Senior Extension Associate with the Department of Forestry at UK and is stationed at the Robinson Center for Appalachian Resource Sustainability. He is responsible for providing technical support to Kentucky's Forest Products Industry with the purpose of enhancing our landowner's ability to market their timber while improving the economic vitality of the local people. Bobby's work encompasses conducting and facilitating training and one on one outreach programs designed specifically for the expansive wood industry here in Kentucky and the surrounding region. His work also includes programming that is designed and targeted to the general public and youth in the area. The Win With Wood program and the adult woodworking workshops conducted at the UK Wood Utilization are examples of his activities. The intent of these programs are to educate the public about forestry and forest related issues that are impacting all of us living in the region.
